

MKCU TID-BITS: "Remember When?"

- The Credit Union newsletter was a part of the Mid-Kansas Co-op Ass'n newsletter through December 1975 and began as an independent publication in 1976.
- MKCU was one of the sponsors for a special SINGATHON Sunday afternoons in 1971 on Radio Station KNEX.
- The "Hidden Number" contest was in the newsletter from 1971 to 2007.
- Jane Regehr edited the newsletter and in 1971 started "Jabbers by Jane" with fun stories, cartoons, and quips.
- Worlds of Fun opened in 1973, and in 1974, they offered discounted passports to credit union members across the state of Kansas. In 1975, passports were offered in the following amounts: Adults for \$6.50 and children for \$5.50
- Far-Mar-Co in Hutchinson started processing our transactions in 1974. Items were mailed to Far-Mar-Co twice a week to be keyed in to the computer. In 1978, a computer terminal was installed in the Moundridge office which allowed staff to key in transactions on a daily basis.
- Quarterly statements replaced passbooks in 1974.
- Direct Deposit, Money Orders and Expandachek accounts were made available to members in 1980.
- A night depository was installed in Moundridge in July of 1981.
- The Buhler branch opened April 16, 1990.
- A new building was constructed in Moundridge in 1999.
- A new building was constructed in Buhler in 2004 with new services: a drive-up window and safe deposit boxes.

Free Trials Can Prove to be Costly

"What a great offer! A risk-free trial sample of miracle wrinkle remover, weight loss supplement or just what I need to get the firm abs I've always dreamt of. It does say free. It must be a great deal! All I have to do is give them my debit or credit card number to pay for the shipping."

Little do you know that in a matter of days you will be charged an additional \$89.99 for this product you ordered. When you call the company to ask for a refund chances are you will be unsuccessful. This scenario is happening all too frequently.

Please keep the following in mind:

- Check the company's reputation with the Better Business Bureau before ordering
- When you place the order you are agreeing to the company's terms and conditions
- The company stores your card number and will bill you later
- You must cancel within the grace period, normally 14 days from when you placed the order
- Ask for a cancellation number and retain this and the date you called
- You have given the company your card number so it is not considered fraud. MKCU will not be able to refund your money.
- If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is!
