I recently attended Kansas Farm Management's South Central Association Summary meeting in McPherson. There was a very good presentation and discussion of 2012 farm financial results in Harvey and McPherson counties.

Basically, a record year for profitability was recorded. Despite the rising input costs and living expenses, the farmers of the 11 South Central Kansas counties had a banner year. Wheat yields, particularly in Harvey County and several counties to the south, led the way. Several of the counties in the west part of the area had the highest level of profit, it appears due to more irrigated land and larger farm size.

I always look forward to studying their Profitlink Summary. I haven't found a better source for enterprise analysis and being able to compare types of enterprises against each other. From my years in Northwest Kansas, I have a great deal of respect for Farm Management Association and their record keeping systems.

Lets hope 2013 brings us the same type of profit results!!

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May was a very busy month for consumer loans, and car loans are a very large part of these loans. The old cars eventually wear out and will need to be replaced. If they do break down, the challenge is always to decide if to repair or replace. The general rule is to replace if the repairs are more than 50% of the value. Ideally the option is to replace before repairs are needed. This starts by saving for the next purchase. Automatic transfers from payroll deposits are a good way to start this. If you are able to save the amount of a car payment each month for three months, it shows you have the ability to make the payment when you do find a replacement.

Finding a replacement vehicle can be a challenge. I am sure if you let a car salesman know you are looking, they would be glad to help. Do your homework before shopping. Pick a vehicle that provides your needs and then pick the color. If you have a family with children, a shiny two door may not be good for hauling home lots of groceries or taking the kids to ball practice and a 4 wheel drive may be good in snow, but gets lousy gas mileage the rest of the year.

Our rates are posted under the Rate link and you can check out vehicles for sale under the "For Sale" link. This would also be a good place to list a vehicle if you have one to sell. You can also call or stop in. We are offering 3,9% on vehicles 2010 and newer and 4.9% on 2008 and 2009 models and 5.9% on 2007 and older. We would be glad to help you on your next car loan.

DID YOU KNOW....?

If you have a Mid Kansas Credit Union debit card, you can make cash or check deposits at the ATM at either our Moundridge or Buhler branch. Simply follow the instructions on the screen, and please use the envelopes provided as odd size envelopes easily jam in the machine. Once you make your deposit, up to \$200 of those funds will be available to you immediately.

Best Ways to Carry Money while Traveling

- 1. Divide money in different places whenever possible, divvy up your travel cash and even credit cards into multiple places.
- Keep small bills handy— Make smaller denominations of currency easily accessible and make money preparation a part of your morning routine. You don't want to be paying for a can of pop with a \$100 bill.
- 3. Carry an Anti-Theft bag—some purses, backpacks and bags are designed specifically for travel and come with features such as cut-proof fabric, steel cable reinforced straps, and locking zippers. You can get these products from Pacsafe, Travelon and Magellans.
- Trim your wallet—take time to go through your wallet and take out everything but the necessities.
- 5. Buy a travel wallet—get one specifically for traveling. One reason is if you are the type of person whose day to day wallet is packed with library cards, gym memberships, etc, the pockets are likely to be stretched out when you minimize the cards. By having a travel one, your cards will be snug and won't accidentally slip out.
- Adapt to local money culture—know if you are going to a cash economy where you need a variety of bills and coins or if you are heading to a location that uses primarily cards.
- 7. Stow valuables securely—leaving things in the in-room safe is generally pretty secure. Just remember you put items in the safe and get them out before you leave.
